15.Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

Scottish Church College has started implementing CCF system 2022 under NEP2020. Under this system integration of multidisciplinary approach in offering the subjects to students at the time of admission is being followed. For example initially a student pursuing BSc in Zoology took minor as Chemistry/Botany/Microbiology only. There was no scope of choosing subjects like History/ Philosophy/ Sanskrit/ etc. In the multidisciplinary approach now under IDC students can choose these latter subjects. This has definitely given the students a diversified perspective of learning and effectively paves the path towards holistic development of the student. Also the student gets a chance to choose his/her choice of subject of interest apart from the Major and Minor ones.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

The multiple entry and exit options and the Academic Bank of Credits system offers a lot of opportunity & flexibility for the students to opt for multidisciplinary courses, programmes and transfer to other institutions ensuring smooth and systematic academic mentoring by faculty, upgrading the course design and delivery strategy to meet the National Higher Educational Qualification Framework (NHEQF), the facility and functionality to comply with Academic Bank of Credits platform under Digilocker Framework. The College as an affiliated institution under University of Calcutta has participated in meeting conducted by the University on ABC. As per the future guidelines of the University the same will be carried out. The college has various national and international linkages. Should ABC is implemented by the university, the college can send and take up students following the ABC system. College has tied up with Common Services Centr (CSC) to provide ABC for students.

17.Skill development:

The college is committed to provide continuous skill development programmes for the students. In this regard the IQAC collaborated with the departments to carry out such initiatives. A soft skill development programme was conducted alongwith departments of History, Philosophy and Political Science in May 2022. Also the department of Business administration conducted skill development programme on GST computation in collaboration with the Institute of Cost Accountants on India. The department of Botany conducted skill development programme on using sophisticated instruments for Biological Sciences for students of

Botany, Zoology, Chemistry and Microbiology. The college continues to organise such skill development programmes for students.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

Scottish Church College being an affiliated institution under University of Calcutta follows the curriculum as specified by University of Calcutta. The college is a Heritage institution being established in 1830. Being an ancient institution the college offers three major Indian languages Sanskrit, Bengali and Hindi. These languages form major teaching media in the institution. Apart from these Philosophy is also a major subject. Philosophy integrates Indian philosophical system like Carvaka, Nyaya, Vaishesika, Vedanta, Mimamsa etc. The curriculum of Sanskrit department integrates focusses areas in the Sanskrit Language, Vedic Literature, Classical Sanskrit Literature, Indian Linguistics, Indian Orthodox (Astika) Philosophies (Nyaya, Vaisheshika, Samkhya, Yoga, Mimamsa, Vedanta) and Non-Orthodox (Nastika) philosophies (Jainism, Buddhism, Charvaka), Indian Poetics, Indian Epistemology, Indian Social Institutions, Indian Architecture, Ancient Science Tradition, History of Indian Music, Sanskrit Grammar, Indian Aesthetics, History of Indian Knowledge Systems and the Impact of Indian Knowledge System in India and abroad. Physics department conducted Arduino based model inter college competition and poster competition on regional language to promote regional language. Students from various local schools were also invited to participate in the said event. Even English department has Indian literature integrated in their curriculum like Bankim Ch. Chattopadhyay's Rajmohan's wife, Autobiography of an unknown Indian by Nirod c. Chaudhuri, Rasshundari Devi Amar Jibon. In Political Science there is a paper on Indian Political thought which discusses the organic theory of the state "Saptaanga theory of Kautilya", Dandaniti (theory of power and coercion) and Rajamandala theory (Kautilya's diplomacy) to conceptualize the Indian notions of power and politics. Kautilya's Arthasashtra also explores the importance of secularisation of politics and its relevance in Indian knowledge system. This paper also describes the Indian ideas related to state and social groups. Moreover this paper also enlightens the students about the important features of ancient political thought which include caste system, relationship between religion and politics and lastly the ancient idea of Indian public life.

19.Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

The institution feels the importance of implementing OBE for all

programmes in the college and implemented the same to all departments from the academic year 2019-2020. There is increased focus on the course's attainment by the students through Course Outcomes, Programme Specific Outcomes and Programme Outcomes. PO PSO Co CSO are duly uploaded in the college website and made available to the students. Summative assessment of 75% was measured on the basis of final year examination result (Direct attainment) and 25% was measured on the basis of feedback from students and parents.

20.Distance education/online education:

The college at the time of pandemic offered online mode of teaching-learning. Through google classroom, google meet and college Learning Management System courses were taught to students. Post pandemic LMS mode of imparting teaching-learning process is still going on. Teachers also conduct classes as per their convenience on google meet platform. There isn't any distance learning system in the college.

Importance is given to class size and preparation allotted per class. There are practices of internal assessment in the institution. Further care is given to the language proficiency of the students and regular parent-teacher meeting, The institution takes care to ensure that there is holistic development meets the three Rs' in curriculum development, namely rigorous, relevance and relationship. This is to ensure that students can face the challenges of globalization, face competitions, integrate connections with the real world and develop life skills. The faculty oversees the connectivity and interaction among students through processes to organize the skill of learning. Our students are able to tackle multi-levels of activity and challenges. Through time table, lesson plan, academic calendar a proper curriculum delivery is maintained. Again departments like Zoology, Botany, History, Bengali, BBA conduct experiential study tour for the students for better understanding of the curriculum.

The college, being affiliated to the University of Calcutta, follows strictly the Academic Calendar as prescribed by the University from time to time for conducting academic affairs like admission, registration, filling up of the form, internal examinations, final examinations including theory, practical, tutorial, viva etc. The respective notices can be found on the

college webpage as well as with all the departments. A tentative period is mentioned in the college prospectus. The college prospectus is also handed to the students so that the students are aware of the Academic Session activities. This includes the subject combinations, CBCS details, fee structure etc. Also, a tentative schedule of the NSS Activities, Sports, Students' Activity Club activities are mentioned. The prospectus also focusses on the Library timings and all the Prizes and Medals including scholarships provided to the outstanding students. The list of holidays, vacations and working days are also included. The college holds Parent-Teacher meetings in each academic session. The dates are notified to the students as and when such is decided by the college authority in the Heads of the departments meeting. For field work the individual department conducts departmental meeting and fixes the dates. The students are informed accordingly.

2.5.1 - Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode. Write description within 200 words.

As Scottish Church College is an affiliated college under University of Calcutta, we have to abide by the end semester assessment pattern as laid out by the University of Calcutta. However, as part of teaching learning process, Formative assessments are designed in various ways.

- 1) The students are monitored during class and mentoring sessions to identify their learning needs and progress.
- 2) Oral question answer sessions and class tests are regularly conducted during the class.
- 3) Mid-term tests are conducted in the middle of the semester.
- 4) Mock tests are conducted keeping in mind the standard of final University examination as well as various competitive entrance examinations for higher studies.
- 5) Group projects are planned to encourage higher order learning.
- 6) Methods of evaluation are decided in departmental meetings based on feedbacks taken from students and guardians.
- 7) Performances of the students are communicated to their guardians.

After the written Internal examinations, evaluation and scrutiny of the answer papers are done by the subject teachers. The college has both online and offline feedback mechanism through which the students can submit their grievances related to examination. The College encourages and nurtures quality research in numerous ways. Many of the faculty members engaged themselves in high quality research work.

It is worth mentioning that college has developed a high quality research laboratory containing sophisticated instruments like Fluorescence microscope, Gel documentation system etc. through BOOST grant of Government of West Bengal. In continuation, this year Post Graduate Department of Botany and Chemistry has received DST-FIST grant of 1.02 crore from Govt. of India to develop our existing research facility. Under this project our college has prepared another sophisticated instrumentation centre where HPLC, Flurimeter, Cyclic voltameter, Real-time PCR etc. instruments will be kept. These facilities will be utilized by various departments of our college and others.

Many faculty members are engaged in guiding PhD students. Teachers are also guiding Post Graduate dissertations work and internship.

Faculty members regularly publish books, book chapters and research papers in high quality peer reviewed scopus indexed or UGC care listed journals.

Faculty members also participate and attend conferences regularly and make presentations.

College has developed a Research and Development Cell to set the research goal and also supporting their faculty members by providing a small research grant (SCCFRG) to smoothly conduct their research.

The Science departments have procured several sophisticated instruments from different research grants and post graduate funds.

Scottish Church College has a separate private static network from BSNL which was first initiated in the academic session 2015-16 in March. The college is currently going with FIBRO ULD 5999 plan, which provides 80Gb/day@upto 70Mbps under FTTH. This college has 17 POE switches and has a static IP address(117.147.65.47). Each

department has limited Internet access to reduce the data usage. Each access point is password protected and has the permission for visiting certain sites only which excludes social networking sites, YouTube, etc. so that educational purpose of the facility is properly utilised. Each department has one or more smart classrooms where the classroom is equipped with smart short range projectors, laser, smart-pad with stylus. Each department can use these facilities by connecting the projector to laptops/desktops which the college provides to each department. The facility also allows editing the projected document with a smart pad and stylus. The edited document can also be saved in various file formats for future use. CCTV cameras fully cover the entire college and which is monitored from Principals' office. The record is kept for 15 days for future references. Principal can also view the footage from CCTV cameras from anywhere.

- **Solid waste management:** Solid waste is segregated. We keep bins on each floor in classrooms, laboratories, and toilets. During College hours students and staff throw the waste materials inside the bins. Solid and liquid wastes generated in the science laboratories are collected separately and disposed off separately. This garbage is collected and disposed off to the nearby Compactor machine (maintained by Kolkata Municipal Corporation). The solid wastes generated from the garden along with vegetable wastes are used in vermicomposting pit to generate manure which is used for college gardening purposes. A total of 14 vermicomposting pits have been constructed which provide 2000 kg of manure annually. This satisfies 90% of the requirement for fertilizer in maintaining the beautiful flower garden.

- **Liquid waste management:** The liquid wastes are generated in our College in laboratories like Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, and Microbiology. Special bins are kept in the laboratories for waste segregation where the students dispose off used chemicals and in

another bin the broken (having sharp-ended) glass goods. The water distillation apparatus is installed in laboratories (40 liters of distilled water is produced daily, 400 liters of effluent water).

The water dripping from Air Conditioners is also collected in the buckets to water plants in some of the places inside the campus. The Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, and Microbiology departments have set up a collection unit for their distillation plant outlet. The collected water from the distillation unit is used for gardening and cleaning purposes

Title of the Practice: Green Campus

The main objectives for this initiative were environmental awareness and education, the use of sustainable energy and energy efficient measures, recycling and composting, and green landscaping on the campus. However, the main challenge is the proper translation of education for sustainable development into practice so that it can be more effective. Vermicomposting, water conservation, rainwater harvesting, and solar energy are some ways the college addresses important sustainable goals. The data for the campus audit project was collected by the undergraduate students which has developed a sense of responsibility in them. The main problem encountered in the Green Campus initiative is the development and maintenance of proper infrastructure for green practices.

Title of the Practice: Sabuj Mon

This informal school aims to organize remedial classes for the students of college-adopted slums in Bagmari, Kolkata. On 20th March 2018, this informal school was inaugurated. About 30 students, aged between 5 to 13 years, were enrolled. Classes are arranged on Tuesdays and Saturdays every week. The classes are mainly taken by undergraduate students of college under the supervision of teaching faculties. At present, the school has 51 students. One student has cleared the higher secondary exam and has been admitted to Scottish Church College as an undergraduate student.

It is worth mentioning that college has developed a high quality research laboratory containing sophisticated instruments like Fluorescence microscope, Gel documentation system etc. through BOOST grant of Government of West Bengal. In continuation, this year Post Graduate Department of Botany and Chemistry has received DST-FIST grant of 1.02 crore from Govt. of India to develop our existing research facility. Under this project our college has prepared another sophisticated instrumentation centre where HPLC, Fluorimeter, Cyclic

voltameter, Real-time PCR etc. instruments will be kept. These facilities will be utilized by various departments of our college and others.

Many faculty members are engaged in guiding PhD students. Teachers are also guiding Post Graduate dissertations work and internship.

Faculty members regularly publish books, book chapters and research papers in high quality peer reviewed Scopus indexed or UGC care listed journals.

Faculty members also participate and attend conferences regularly and make presentations.

College has developed a Research and Development Cell to set the research goal and also supporting their faculty members by providing a small research grant (SCCFRG) to smoothly conduct their research.

Scottish Church College has a separate private static network from BSNL which was first initiated in the academic session 2015-16 in March. The college is currently going with FIBRO ULD 5999 plan, which provides 80Gb/day@upto 70Mbps under FTTH. This college has 17 POE switches and has a static IP

address(117.147.65.47). Each department has limited Internet access to reduce the data usage. Each access point is password protected and has the permission for visiting certain sites only which excludes social networking sites, YouTube, etc. so that educational purpose of the facility is properly utilised. Each department has one or more smart classrooms where the classroom is equipped with smart short range projectors, laser, smart-pad with stylus. Each department can use these facilities by connecting the projector to laptops/desktops which the college provides to each department. The facility also allows editing the projected document with a smart pad and stylus. The edited document can also be saved in various file formats for future use. CCTV cameras fully cover the entire college and which is monitored from Principals' office. The record is kept for 15 days for future references. Principal can also view the footage from CCTV cameras from anywhere.

• **Solid waste management: Solid waste is segregated. We keep bins on each floor in classrooms, laboratories, and toilets. During College hours students and staff throw the waste materials inside the bins. Solid and liquid wastes generated in the science laboratories are collected separately and disposed off separately. This garbage is collected and disposed off to the nearby Compactor machine (maintained by Kolkata Municipal Corporation). The solid wastes generated from the garden along with vegetable wastes are used in vermicomposting pit to generate manure which is used for college gardening purposes. A total of 14 vermicomposting pits have been constructed which provide 2000 kg of manure annually. This satisfies 90% of the requirement for fertilizer in maintaining the beautiful flower garden.**

• **Liquid waste management:** The liquid wastes are generated in our College in laboratories like Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, and Microbiology. Special bins are kept in the laboratories for waste segregation where the students dispose off used chemicals and in another bin the broken (having sharp-ended) glass goods. The water distillation apparatus is installed in laboratories (40 liters of distilled water is produced daily, 400 liters of effluent water).

The water dripping from Air Conditioners is also collected in the buckets to water plants in some of the places inside the campus. The Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, and Microbiology departments have set up a collection unit for their distillation plant outlet. The collected water from the distillation unit is used for gardening and cleaning purposes

Title of the Practice: Green Campus

The main objectives for this initiative were environmental awareness and education, the use of sustainable energy and energy efficient measures, recycling and composting, and green landscaping on the campus. However, the main challenge is the proper translation of education for sustainable development into practice so that it can be more effective.

Vermicomposting, water conservation, rainwater harvesting, and solar energy are some ways the college addresses important sustainable goals. The data for the campus audit project was collected by the undergraduate students which has developed a sense of responsibility in them. The main problem encountered in the Green Campus initiative is the development and maintenance of proper infrastructure for green practices.

Title of the Practice: Sabuj Mon

This informal school aims to organize remedial classes for the students of college-adopted slums in Bagmari, Kolkata. On 20th March 2018, this informal school was inaugurated. About 30 students, aged between 5 to 13 years, were enrolled. Classes are arranged on Tuesdays and Saturdays every week. The classes

are mainly taken by undergraduate students of college under the supervision of teaching faculties. At present, the school has 51 students. One student has cleared the higher secondary exam and has been admitted to Scottish Church College as an undergraduate student.
