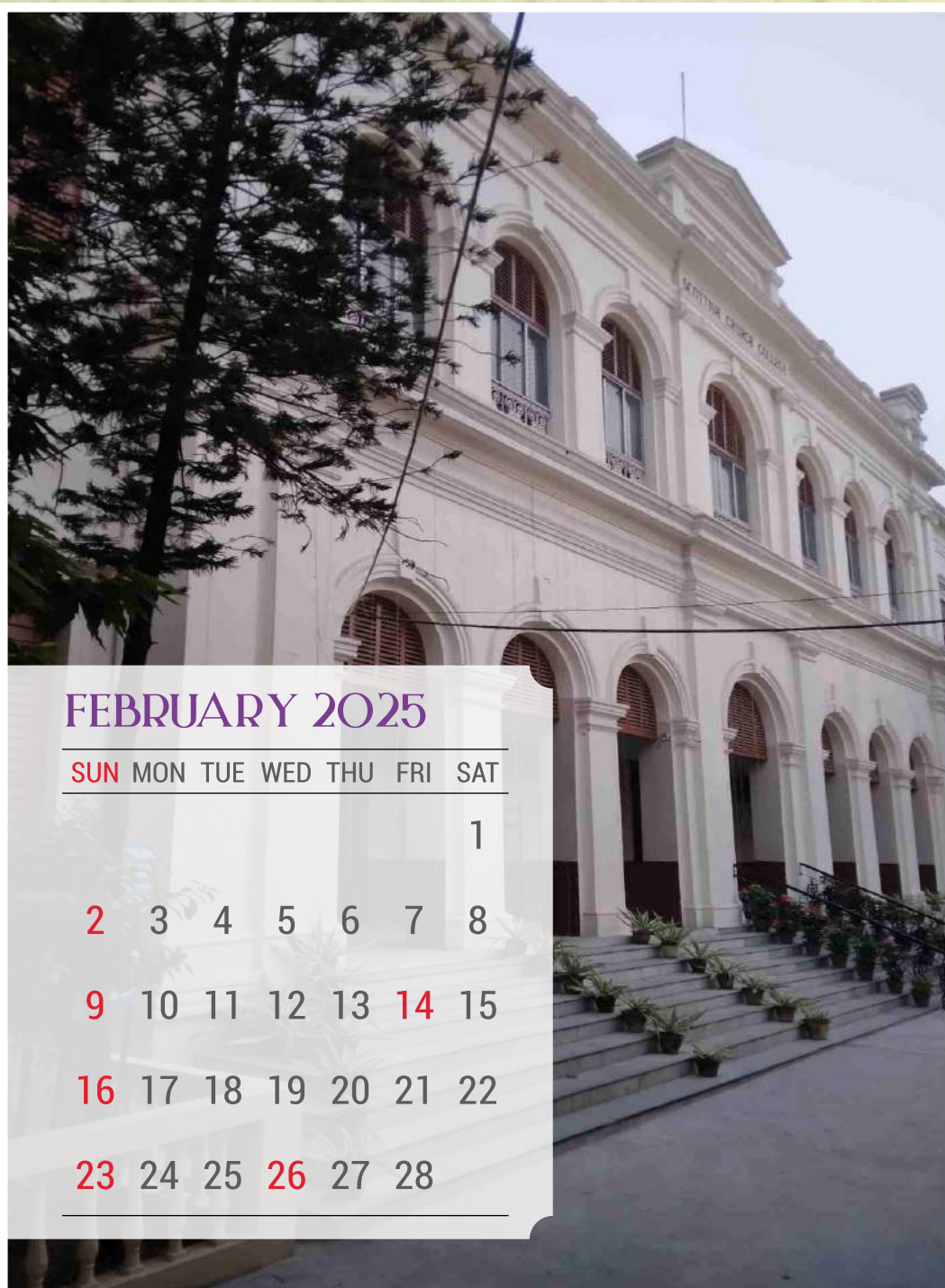


PRAFULLA CHANDRA SEN (1897–1990), graduated from this College in BSc (Physics). He was a devoted Gandhian championing honesty and dedication towards national service, who came to be known as Gandhi of Arambagh. He took up the role of the Food Minister in 1948 and became the Chief Minister of West Bengal between 1962-1967.

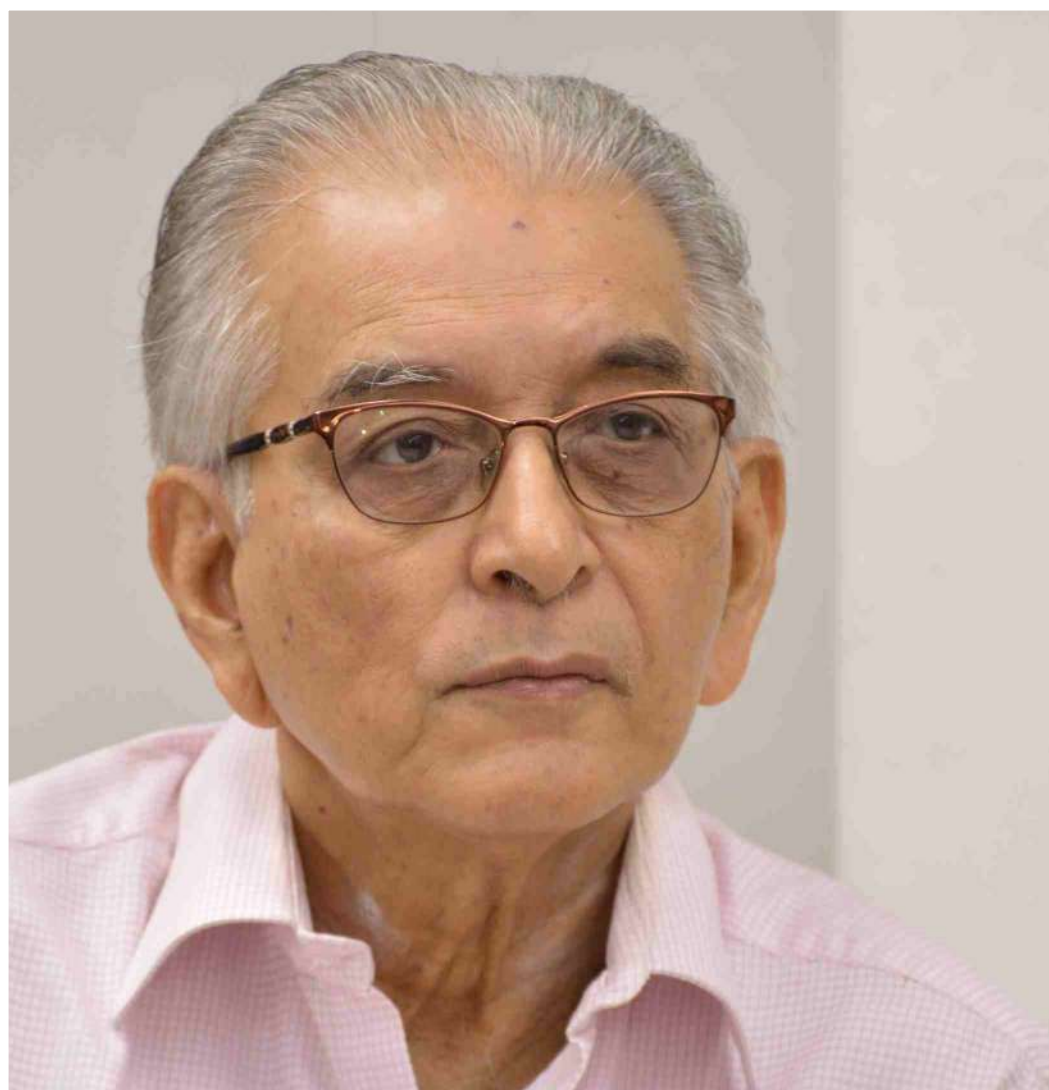

SALSENG CHADA MARAK (1941 – 2024) started his career as an educator but soon joined politics in his state of Meghalaya where he was appointed the sixth Chief Minister, a position he held from 1993 to 1998. His leadership was celebrated for its honesty, transparency, accountability, and an unwavering dedication to the welfare of the people of Meghalaya.



SHYAMAL KUMAR SEN (1940) graduated from the College and studied law at the University of Calcutta. He was appointed the Acting Chief Justice of the Calcutta High Court in 1999 and became the Chief Justice of the Allahabad High Court in 2000. He has served as the Governor of West Bengal from May 1999 to December 1999.

BIRENDRA NARAYAN CHAKRABORTY (1904 – 1976) graduated from the College and joined the Indian Civil Services in 1929. In this capacity he had a stellar career. Among many other important responsibilities, he served as the Ambassador in the Netherlands from 1952 to 1954 and 1955-56, he was the High Commissioner in Ceylon and from 1960 to 1962 in Canada. Chakraborty was a representative of India to the Sixteenth Session (1961) of the United Nations General Assembly. He served as Governor of Haryana from 1967 until his death in office on 26 March 1976.



BANWARI LAL JOSHI (1936 – 2017) graduated from the College and began his career in the state police service in Rajasthan and then served in many important administrative posts in the Government of India. He was Governor of Uttar Pradesh from 2009 to 2014. Before that he was Lieutenant Governor of Delhi from 2004 to 2007 and also served as Governor of Meghalaya and Uttarakhand.

GOPINATH BARDOLOI (1890 –1950) graduated from the College in 1911. He dedicated himself to the Gandhian philosophy and became an active member of the Indian National Congress in the fight against colonial rule. He was the first Chief Minister of Assam from 1946 to 1950 and has enormously contributed towards the growth of a strong state there. In 1999 he was conferred with the Bharat Ratna posthumously.



SUDHI RANJAN DAS (1897 – 1977) completed his intermediaries from the College and received his law degrees from the University of London in 1918. He became an Additional Judge of Calcutta High Court in 1942. He became a Puisne Judge, Calcutta High Court in 1944. From 1949 to 1950 he served as the Chief Justice of Punjab High Court. He officiated twice as Acting Chief Justice of India before he was appointed as the Chief Justice to the Supreme Court of India in 1956. He retired in 1959.

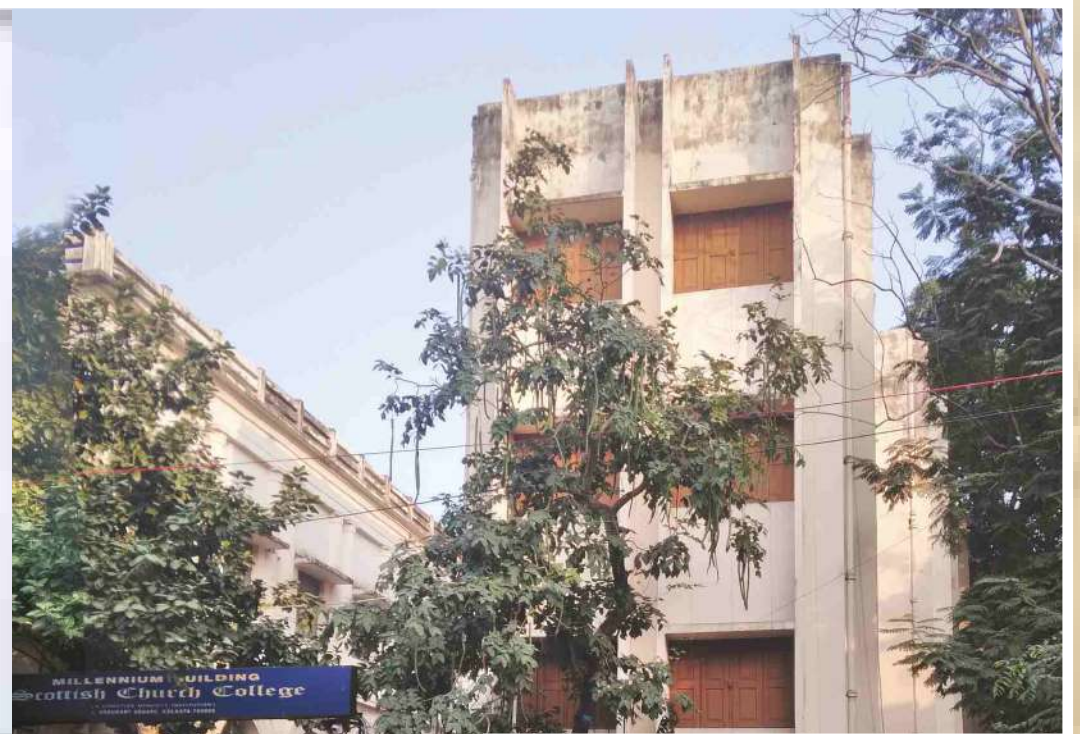

BHUPESH GUPTA (1914 – 1981) graduated from the College and then earned his law degrees from the University College London. In his early days he joined the revolutionary group Anusilan Samity in their fight against the colonial government. Later, he joined the Communist Party and was elected as a Member of the Rajya Sabha in 1952. He remained in the post till his death in 1981. He was the longest-serving member of the Rajya Sabha at the time of his death. Gupta championed women's rights, national integration and the principles of secularism.

B N BANERJEE (1916-2002) after graduating in B.Sc. from the College, he earned his LLB from University of Calcutta and did his LLM from London. He served as the Assistant Solicitor in the Ministry of Law, Government of India, from 1950-52 and was the Legal Adviser to High Commissioner for India in London between 1953-55. He became the Secretary-General of Rajya Sabha in 1963 and remained so till 1976. He was nominated as a member of Rajya Sabha in 1976 where he served till his death in 1982.

SNEHANGSHU KANTA ACHARYA (September 1913 –1986) followed up his education at the College with a degree in law. From an early age he was drawn towards India's freedom struggle and the socialism. Since independence he received the First Order of Merit of Syria in 1957 and led several delegations to Europe, Asia and Africa. He served as the Advocate General of West Bengal in two terms from 1969 to 1970 and 1977 to 1986.
