

REV. LAL BEHARI DAY (18th December, 1824 – 28th October, 1892): Lal Behari Day was one of the first five boys admitted by Rev. Alexander Duff to the General Assembly's Institute. He converted to Christianity in 1843 following which from 1855 to 1867 Lal Behari was a missionary and minister of the Free Church of Scotland. And from 1867 to 1888 he worked in the Education Department of the Government. During this time, he worked as a lecturer in English at the Hooghly Mohsin College. He was remembered by his students with much respect and fondness. Day is best known for his two popular works titled, *Folk Tales of Bengal and The History of a Bengal Raiyat*. Scottish Church College thus stands witness to the life of a man who lived and contributed towards what is rather an interesting time in Bengals's social history.
