

AMARENDRANATH CHATTERJEE (1st July, 1880 - 4th September, 1957): The Indian revolutionary Amarendranath Chatterjee graduated from the then Duff College and immediately immersed himself to the cause of his motherland. Inspired by and closely associated with men like Sri Aurobindo Ghosh, Jatin Mukherjee or Bagha Jatin, he was deeply involved with the anti-partition agitation in Bengal at the beginning of the 20th century. A member of the Jugantar group of revolutionaries, Chatterjee was a key figure in the Indo-German conspiracy during the first World War led by Bagha Jatin that ultimately led to the martyrdom of the latter. Amarendra lived a life of a devoted son of his motherland who continuously strived to contribute constructively towards India's freedom struggle. The College salutes this brave alumnus.
